II. Action Items

1. Approve Board of Park Commissioners Minutes from the July 16, 2020 Meeting.

Aldersperson Raasch moved to approve the Board of Park Commissioners minutes from the July 16, 2020 meeting, seconded by Aldersperson Chandik-Kunding. Upon vote, the motion passed unanimously.

2. Consideration & Approval of \$500 Donation from BCCWC for Youth Activities/Equipment.*

Aldersperson Chandik-Kunding moved to accept a \$500 donation from the Brown County Community Women's Club for youth recreation activities and equipment, seconded by Melissa Thiel-Collar. Upon vote, the motion passed unanimously.

3. Consideration and Possible Action of Transferring Sponsorship of 2021 Beer Gardens.

Marty Kosobucki, Director of Parks, Recreation and Forestry explained that the remaining beer gardens for 2020 have been cancelled. All sponsors have been contacted and they would like to transfer their sponsorship to next year. Staff is looking for approval from the Park Board to transfer the sponsorships to the 2021 beer gardens. Alderperson Raasch moved to approve transferring the beer garden sponsorships to 2021, seconded by Alderperson Chandik-Kundinger.

Alderperson Chandik-Kundinger questioned if there are any budget actions that need to be taken due to transferring funds to 2021.

Marty Kosobucki, Director of Parks Recreation and Forestry explained that a request to carry over the sponsorship from Kay Distributing will need to be requested, but the other sponsorships have not come in yet. These will be invoiced next year.

4. Review and Possible Action on Distribution of Youth League Funds.

Marty Kosobucki, Director of Parks, Recreation of Forestry explained that within the budget there are funds set aside for assistance to co-sponsored youth leagues in the city. These funds are contingent on the youth leagues taking place. De Pere Baseball did run their league; De Pere Girls Softball and De pere Rapides Soccer cancelled their league; and De Pere Hockey is still in the decision making process. The leagues that didn't run were asked how vital the funds were to operations, and both girls softball and Rapides soccer stated the funds were not crucial to their funding.

Discussion followed.

Melissa Thiel Collar questioned the ability to give the funds to the league for scholarships.

Alderperson Chandik Kundinger questioned if the funds could be used for field improvements, if the leagues decided not to take the funds.

Alderperson Raasch questioned why De Pere Baseball receives double the funds of what soccer receives. He also stated that he is in favor of the support given to the youth sports leagues.

Randy Soquet questioned if the recreational scholarships can be used for these programs. Marty Kosobucki, Director of Parks, Recreation and Forestry explained that through the Recreational Scholarship program, the city could cover up to 50% of registration fees for eligible families.

Alderperson Raasch moved to approve the distribution of youth league funds as it has been done in the past, seconded by Alderperson Chandik-Kundinger. Upon vote, the motion passed unanimously.

5. Consideration and Possible Action to Approve Bid for Community Center Insulation and Roofing Project*

Paula Rahn, Recreation Superintendent, explained that two bids were received. The budgeted amount for this project was \$100,000. The low bid came in at \$85,770, which includes the alternate bid of \$20,000 to furnish and install fabric covered acoustical panels in the Pine room.

Alderson Raasch moved to approve the low bid from Milbach Construction Services Co. for \$85,770, seconded by Randy Soquet.

Discussion followed.

Marty Kosobucki, Director of Parks, Recreation and Forestry explained that this project needs to be completed because there are severe ice dams that accumulate on the Community Center roof. These dams create large icicles formations, which cause safety concerns for people walking on the sidewalk.

Randy Soquet questioned if the additional budgeted amount could be used for something else.

Marty Kosobucki, Director of Parks, Recreation and Forestry stated he would be cautious in using any additional funds, as there could be unforeseen circumstances that are uncovered once the project starts and change orders might be needed.

Alderson Raasch also cautioned using any additional budget funds and explained that due to the economic downturn, there is a very good chance there will be shared revenue reductions in the next budget from the State.

6. Review and Possible Action to Approve 2019 Recreation & Community Center Annual Report

Paula Rahn, Recreation Superintendent, reviewed the 2019 Recreation and Community Center Annual Report. She stated that 2019 was a very good year. Programming went well; there were 31 new programs offered throughout the year; and all areas of revenue increased, except the pool that went from two pools down to one.

Alderson Raasch moved to approve the 2019 Recreation and Community Center Annual Report, seconded by Melissa Thiel-Collar.

Melissa Thiel-Collar thanked Paula for the amazing work.

Randy Soquet commented on the increase in numbers at the Community Center.

7. Review and Consideration of Draft Budget Proposal for 2021.

Marty Kosobucki, Director of Parks, Recreation and Forestry explained the budget process. The draft budget has already been submitted to the mayor. Any comments or suggestions from the meeting tonight will be relayed to the mayor and administrator. From the draft budget meeting, the mayor prepares his own budget that is presented to

council and in October, there is a budget workshop where the numbers are finalized. The finalized budget is then brought to the council in November, where it is actually adopted. Marty Kosobucki explained that departments were asked to come in at a 0% increase in the operating budget. The Parks, Recreation and Forestry department is not even close to a 0% increase. The biggest reason for the increase is the VFW Aquatic facility opening in 2021. Even though new operating costs will come from the referendum, the facility has a huge impact to the budget. He also explained other significant changes that increase the budget.

Alderson Raasch questioned the increase in pool costs in relation to the referendum, and the organizational structure change at the Community Center.

Alderson Chandik-Kundinger moved to approve the draft budget proposal for recommendation to the mayor, seconded by Melissa Thiel-Collar. Upon vote, the motion passed unanimously.

III. Discussion Items

1. Update on VFW Aquatic Facility Color Selections for Building and Slides.

Marty Kosobucki, Director of Parks, Recreation and Forestry explained that the Park Board chose a general color scheme, and gave staff the direction to choose other colors. The color scheme that was chosen was blue and lime green, to try to match the city logo. Staff felt it would be a good idea to get the Park Boards recommendation for the color of the two large body slides and the drop slide. Staff picked out sky blue and sulphur yellow, which is as close to lime green as we could get, for the body slides and melon yellow for the drop slide. There is an optional lime green color for the slides available for an upcharge, and we have requested information on that cost.

Alderson Chandik-Kundinger stated that it would look nice if the city logo was on the shade structures and would be consistent with city branding. Also, she didn't feel that it would be worth an upcharge for the lime green slide.

Melissa Thiel-Collar dislikes the sulphur yellow slide and would like to see what the upcharge would be for the lime green one.

Marty Kosobucki, Director of Parks, Recreation and Forestry explained that the darker the color for the slides, the more fading will appear. The color choice was just brought to staff on Monday, August 17th and to have the slides delivered on time, we have to order them by September 7th. If the upcharge for the lime green slide is substantial, it would have to be a change order which would need to have approval. If the park board wanted to pursue the lime green slide, we would have time to go directly to council for approval if the upcharge is significant.

The park board recommended staying with the standard colors, but would like to know what the upcharge would be for the lime green slide.

Marty Kosobucki, Director of Parks, Recreation and Forestry explained that he had a virtual meeting with Sommerville regarding the multi-use building at Voyageur Park. Under normal circumstances, Sommerville would propose an in-house workshop to gather concepts and ideas from the park board. However, with COVID-19, Sommerville is proposing to send out a survey to gather input from the park board members and then provide a presentation to the park board in September.

Although we do not open until June 2021, we need to consider and recommend the membership rates for our pool facilities as we will be opening a new Aquatic Facility. Staff conducted research and surveyed many facilities throughout Wisconsin. Below is a brief summary of 2019-2020 data compiled from aquatic facilities (mostly Northeast Wisconsin).

While developing a proposal for considering, staff considering the following factors and reviewed data from other aquatic facilities throughout our state. Please see the attachments that show a comparison of Membership Fees and Day Pass Admission Fees.

In addition to the data, we have compiled three different scenarios in considering for pool membership and daily admission fees. Of the three options, staff would suggest Option #1 at this time.

SUBJECT: Report on 2020 Fall Recreation Classes

Attached is a report on the fall recreation programs and classes offered by our department. The report depicts which classes are running, current enrollment, maximum enrollment allowed and a comparison to last year's fall enrollment.

Thus far, 8 classes were canceled due to low registrations while 27 programs/classes were canceled attributing to factors such as: not being able to use school facilities at the present time and there is not enough room or the capability to host at the Community Center, instructor issues, the ability not to safely offer the program in accordance with Covid protocols or contracted agencies canceled. Some fitness classes have been offered outdoors only while others have been offered in a hybrid version which means it is limited in person along with a virtual format for those that prefer that method and would like to stay in the comfort of their own home. Almost all of our fitness classes have decreased participation compared to last year. Our Kidz Zone Before/After School Program has decent numbers along with the Youth Dance classes, Poms, and Flag Football Programs, all which had adjusted maximum participation to accommodate for Covid protocols. At present, the Adult Basketball League has been put on hold and may possibly start in November or after the first of the year.

Overall, we are fortunate to continue to offer community recreation programs in as safe a manner as possible. Staff will be in contact with the schools to see if there are any possibilities of starting our basketball league in November and moving dance, fitness, water aerobics and swim lessons back to the schools.
