ORDINANCE #20-10
CREATING SECTION 74-13 DE PERE MUNICIPAL
CODE REQUIRING FACE COVERINGS

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, the Common Council of the City of De Pere adopted Resolution #20-34 declaring a state of emergency in the City of De Pere as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the emergency power granted to the governing body by Wis. Stat. § 323.14(4)(a) includes the general authority to order, by ordinance or resolution, whatever is necessary and expedient for the health, safety, protection, and welfare of persons and property within the local unit of government in the emergency; and

WHEREAS, if, because of the emergency conditions, the governing body of the local unit of government is unable to meet promptly, Resolution #20-34 and Wis. Stat. § 323.14(4)(b) grants the Mayor, or in the absence of the Mayor, the Council President, the authority to act under Wis. Stats. § 323.11 and § 323.14(4)(a); and

WHEREAS, any proclamation issued under Wis. Stat. § 323.14(4)(b) is subject to ratification, alteration, modification, or repeal by the governing body as soon as that body can meet, but the subsequent action taken by the governing body shall not affect the prior validity of the proclamation; and

WHEREAS, many individuals with COVID-19 may be asymptomatic or may experience a delayed onset of symptoms, during which time such individuals may transfer the virus to others; and

WHEREAS, wearing a cloth face covering over both the nose and the mouth greatly reduces the risk of continued community spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, as of June 28, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) information on the use of cloth face coverings to prevent the spread of COVID-19 includes the following:

1. The CDC recommends that all people 2 years of age and older wear a cloth face covering in public settings and when around people who do not live in their household, especially when other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.
2. Studies have shown that wearing a cloth face covering can prevent the spread of COVID-19.
3. Cloth face coverings are most likely to reduce the spread of COVID-19 when they are widely used by most people in public settings.
4. Cloth face coverings should not be worn by children under the age of 2 years old or by anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove their own face covering without assistance.

WHEREAS, the City of De Pere has an interest in protecting the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of De Pere from the continued spread of COVID-19 throughout the community; and

WHEREAS, an ordinance requiring face coverings to be worn by any person in a public place within the City of De Pere directly serves that interest by avoiding and/or reducing the further spread of COVID-19 and minimizing the strain on health care resources, while enabling the continuation of essential services, businesses, and social and commercial life during the state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, area healthcare organizations, including Aurora BayCare Medical Center, BayCare Clinic, Bellin Health, HSHS St. Vincent St. Mary's, and Prevea Health, have expressed in a letter to Mayor Boyd and the Common Council, support for face covering requirements; and

WHEREAS, the City of Green Bay adopted an ordinance requiring face coverings which will become effective on July 27, 2020, and the City of De Pere desires to maintain consistency throughout the surrounding metro area; and

WHEREAS, the City of De Pere intends to gain voluntary compliance from all individuals with the recommendations from the CDC and local healthcare providers concerning the wearing of face coverings, but recognizes that penalties are necessary to ensure such compliance.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DE PERE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. De Pere Municipal Code Section 74-13. – Face Coverings Required, is hereby created to read:

Sec. 74-13. – Face Coverings Required.

(a) Definitions. In this section:

- (1) “Face covering” means a manufactured or homemade cloth covering that fully covers an individual’s nose and mouth that is secured with ear straps or otherwise tied so as to prevent slipping, and/or a face shield which covers the mouth and nose, covers the side of the face, and is secured on the head.
- (2) “Indoor area accessible to the public” means any interior area of any structure or premises licensed by the City of De Pere or used in whole or in part as a place of resort, assemblage, lodging, trade, traffic, occupancy, or other use by the public, to which the public customarily has access.
- (3) “Qualifying vehicle” means a paratransit vehicle, a taxi, a private car service vehicle, a ride-sharing vehicle, or any other for-hire vehicle.

(b) Face Coverings Required. Every individual age five (5) and older who is present in the City of De Pere shall wear a face covering that covers their nose and mouth in indoor areas accessible to the public and while driving or riding public transportation or a qualifying vehicle, unless exempted under this section.

(c) Exemptions. This section shall not apply to:

- (1) Any individual who has trouble breathing or is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove their own face covering without assistance.
 - (2) Any individual who falls within the CDC's guidance for those who should not wear face coverings due to a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents them from wearing a face covering.
 - (3) Any individual who is communicating with an individual who is deaf or hard of hearing and communication cannot be achieved through other means.
 - (4) Individuals for whom wearing a face covering would create a risk to the person related to their work, as determined by government safety guidelines.
 - (5) Individuals in settings where it is not practical or feasible to wear face coverings when obtaining or rendering goods or services to the extent necessary to obtain or render such goods and services, including but not limited to the receipt of dental services or medical treatments, or consuming food or beverages.
 - (6) Individuals speaking to an audience, whether in person or through a broadcast, as long as the speaker remains six feet or more away from other individuals.
 - (7) Any individual actually engaged in exercising in a gym or other similar indoor facility, so long as physical separation of not less than six (6) feet is maintained and the individual wears a face covering at all times when not actually engaged in exercising.
 - (8) Whenever federal, state, or local law otherwise prohibit wearing a face covering or where it is necessary to evaluate or verify an individual's identity.
 - (9) Places of Worship.
- (d) Enforcement.
- (1) Any individual who fails to comply with this section shall be asked to leave by an authorized representative of the business or organization. If the individual refuses to leave or continues to refuse to comply with this section, the individual shall be subject to a municipal forfeiture as established by resolution of the Council, or any other law the individual may violate. Businesses and organizations may rely on an individual's statements if they claim to be exempt from this section for the reasons permitted herein.
 - (2) Any business violating this section may be subject to administrative action for any licenses they possess with the City.

(3) The Health Director, the Police Chief, and their designees, are authorized to enforce this section.

SECTION 2. Sunset Provision. This ordinance is hereby repealed upon termination of the City of De Pere's Declaration of Emergency.

SECTION 3. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect on and after its passage and publication as provided by law.

Dear Governor Evers,

We are writing this letter in support of a statewide ordinance requiring face coverings in public settings when around people who do not live in the same household. COVID-19 has infected millions of Americans and caused substantial suffering and excessive deaths. Dear Mayor Boyd and City of De Pere City Council Members:

We are writing this letter in support of your consideration and adoption of a city-wide ordinance requiring face coverings in appropriate circumstances.

The CDC recommends that people wear cloth face coverings in public settings when around people who do not live in the same household. The reason that they recommend face coverings is because studies have shown that wearing a face covering can prevent the spread of COVID-19. These results are best achieved when face coverings are widely used by people in public settings. Exceptions for children under 2 years of age and limited exceptions for adults because of trouble breathing, loss of consciousness, incapacitation, or inability to remove the mask without assistance should be allowed.

As healthcare organizations in the City of Green Bay, we are committed to caring for all people in this region. Our ability to provide healthcare for all people in the region would be impaired if the number of COVID-19 cases requiring hospitalization exceeds our capacity. We have been proponents for the precautionary steps necessary to flatten the curve and our commitment to those precautionary steps remains while COVID-19 continues as a threat to the health of our region.

Therefore, we are supportive of an ordinance that requires mandatory face coverings covering the nose and mouth while in indoor areas accessible to the public or while riding in any public

bus, with exceptions allowed for removing the face covering while eating or drinking in a restaurant or bar.

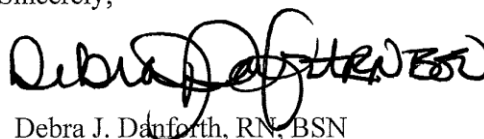

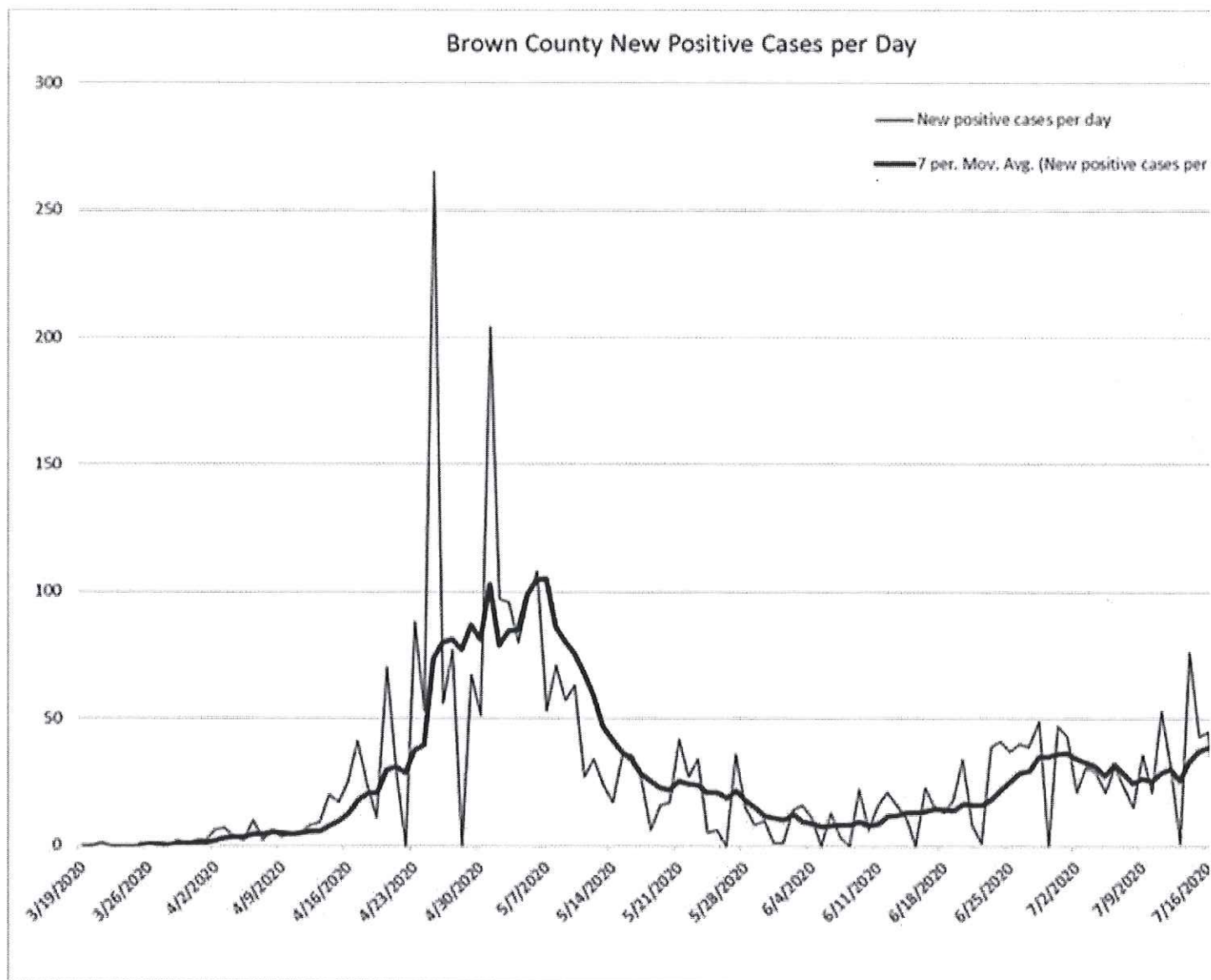

The US and Wisconsin continue to see cases climb and with a new school year a little less than a month away, we need to take action to reduce cases!

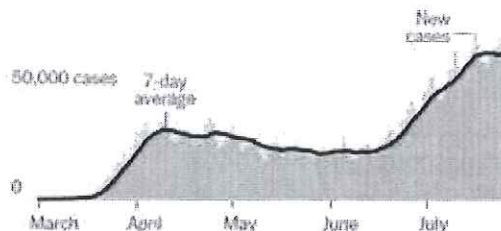
The WHO and CDC agree that masks can limit the spread of COVID, and I believe mandating masks is our best chance to returning to "normal" as quickly as possible.

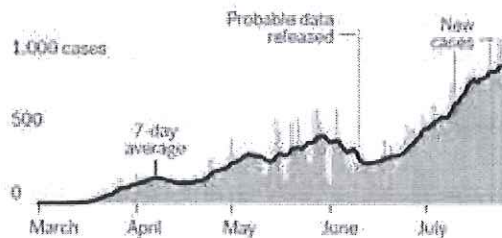

I am writing this email as an owner of 2 small businesses in DePere as well as a parent of a WDP high-school student.

I urge you to vote for a mask ordinance. I strongly believe that after a month or two of everyone wearing masks, the #s of local cases will decrease which **will allow all small businesses to thrive more** and ensure our kids can be back in in-person learning.

One of my businesses focuses on health-care/biotech companies. I've had out-of-area clients cancel my participation in onsite assignments due to the fact that I even LIVE in a city that doesn't require masks. (Even though I choose to wear them.)

At our other downtown DePere business, we've had employees who work other 'day jobs' that don't require masks, which has resulted in 2 of them having to miss multiple shifts at our business while they awaited test-results from being exposed at their other jobs. We paid for them to miss these shifts since it was more important to us to ensure they weren't in our space AT ALL, even if it meant paying them to not work, because that was the right thing to do. We always lean on the side of safety and we've had to ask these employees to stay home for weeks at a time, vs letting their other employers' risky non-mask policies potentially infect our business.

As a resident, we've been shocked at how many area businesses don't even have employees in masks? There's been several times we've tried to support local restaurants with to-go orders, then arrived to find no one working is even wearing a mask?

The most important thing to consider however, is that this is a way to protect small biz' employees from having to be the enforcer of each businesses' policy. If it was a city-wide ordinance, the employees would be saved from having to argue with customers about why they are requesting masks. It backs them up. It saves them from political arguments. I know it is our responsibility to parent our child and enforce our own rules, but it is hard on a teen to be 'the only one' in a mask

I urge you to ignore politics, side with SAFETY, risk being unpopular for a moment, and do the right thing to ensure our schools and businesses can survive this mess until there is a vaccine. **DePere has always looked forward**. Hello De Pere leadership!

My wife and I quietly set up shop in De Pere this past April. We are renting a commercial kitchen from Saks Holdings at 365 Main. We make hummus and other food products. We are happy to be a De Pere business; though we picked an odd time to become one! In the past, we owned Kavarna Coffeehouse (which we sold in 2019) and, more locally, the Locktender's House, which we ran as a concession stand for two summers. While our kitchen—which is a state licensed food manufacturing facility—is not currently open to the public, we are very familiar with the dynamics of running a food establishment. We are very much in support of the mask ordinance for the following reasons:

1. From a public health standpoint, it works. It is recommended by every credible public health agency in the world and is a policy that has helped to 'flatten the curve' and reduce the rate of transmission in every country that is doing better than the United States. Had this been national policy from the beginning, we may very well be experiencing some semblance of normality today instead of reaching 150,000 confirmed deaths.
2. This policy will help shopkeepers and restaurateurs keep themselves and their staff safe. Right now, there are customers who refuse to wear masks going into peoples' businesses and being hostile.
3. We believe that the number of customers who are not patronizing businesses because they do not want to be in a shop with fellow customers who are not wearing mask IS GREATER than the number of customers who will stop going to area businesses.

The question of enforcement is a difficult one. In Green Bay, I agreed with Alderman Jesse Brunnette that using administrative penalties (pulling licenses, etc.) was an unfair way to enforce compliance by businesses. Different types of businesses depend on licensing in different ways. In my opinion, it would be more fair to use a fine as a means of enforcement.

I also agreed with some of the opposition in Green Bay that it makes sense to define an endpoint to the policy. I do think that Green Bay left that too vague. De Pere has the opportunity, with a little more time, to improve upon Green Bay's ordinance.

We look forward to the day when we can play a more meaningful role in making De Pere a better place. We have several ideas for our uBu Kitchen that involve the public. The sooner we conquer this pandemic, the

sooner we can contribute to the community.

Dear Mayor Boyd, and City of De Pere City Council Members,

I am writing to you today in full support of the proposed citywide masking ordinance.

Currently, I serve as the St. Norbert College Health Services Director and have been in this position for approximately four years. Prior to my employment with the College, I have served as the City of De Pere Health Director, Brown County Maternal, Child Health Nurse Manager, Washington County, Iowa Public Health Manager, Oneida County Health Department Assistant Director/Nurse Manager and Public Health Nurse. With this experience I have dedicated my career to public health advocating for, and implementing sound public health recommendations to protect the health of the communities that I have worked, lived and recreated.

The proposed ordinance is intended to do just that, protect the health of the residents and visitors of the City of De Pere. In fact, we have a duty to protect the most vulnerable population in our communities by doing three things: wearing a mask, watching our distance and washing our hands. Until we have a vaccine or effective antivirals to combat COVID 19, these are the only countermeasures we have in our toolbox. These public health strategies are timeless, have been proven effective historically, and will do the same today.

Science has validated that masking decreases the transmission risk of COVID-19. According to the CDC, "Cloth face coverings are one of the most powerful weapons we have to slow and stop the spread of the virus-particularly when used universally within a community setting".

Face coverings have been and will be required for everyone on campus; whether indoors or outdoors (except in the students' private living spaces). St. Norbert College took a strong position on masking very early and has incorporated this countermeasure into the College's Return to Campus plan in an attempt to mitigate the risk for our students, faculty and staff. As a college, we need to do all we can to assure that students, faculty and staff can re-establish some sort of normalcy. We know that teaching and learning is most effective in-person. FOR VIOLATIONS OF SECTION 74-13 DE PERE

The Common Council hereby imposes the following forfeitures to be included in the Municipal Court Bond Schedule for violation of Section 74-13 De Pere Municipal Code as follows:

First Offense: \$10.00

Second Offense: \$25.00

Third and Subsequent Offense: \$50.00

Said forfeitures shall be subject to additional penalties, fees and other costs required by law as included in the Municipal Court Bond Schedule.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT:

The penalties established hereunder shall be effective as of the effective date of Ordinance 20-10 Creating Section 74-13 De Pere Municipal Code Requiring Face Coverings.
