Public Works Director Scott Thoresen reviewed the issues with the existing ordinance and presented the changes that would occur with the new ordinance. Discussion followed regarding Nicolet Square, screen requirements, overflow tags, notification of properties, and allowance for carts. Alderperson Donovan moved, seconded by Alderperson Rafferty to open the meeting. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously. Larry Sesette came forward to explain that he is complying with the 3 cart rule but is still receiving letters from the City. James Fritsche explained that small businesses like his are being treated unfairly by the 3 cart limitation. Dave Breecher came forward and explained that 3 carts are not enough for the 12 children living at his residential home. Alderperson Jennings moved, seconded by Alderperson Boyd to close the meeting. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously. Discussion followed with the City Council and Public Works Director Scott Thoresen regarding the 3 cart limit, exchanging smaller carts for larger carts, and overflow tags. Alderperson Donovan moved, seconded by Alderperson Raasch to open the meeting. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously. Dave Breecher asked for a 4 cart limit on residential properties. Public Works Director Scott Thoresen explained that because the majority of single family homes only have 2 carts, 3 carts is the reasonable number to cap the limit at. Alderperson Donovan moved, seconded by Alderperson Boyd to close the meeting. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously. Discussion followed.

Alderperson Crevier asked when razing the building would be complete; Parks Director Marty Kosobucki explained that the intent is to clear the building before the Brown County Fair and that the Fire Department has used it for training already. Alderperson Raasch moved, seconded by Alderperson Crevier to open the meeting. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously. Steve Corrigan, President of the Brown County Fair Association, came forward and explained why the association wants to make more space on the property by razing the building and that they are waiting to raze the building to get test results back verifying whether or not there is asbestos in the plaster. He thanked the City Council and City staff for their support of the Fair. Alderperson Jennings moved, seconded by Alderperson Raasch to close the meeting. Upon vote, motion carried unanimously. Alderperson Rafferty asked about notifying the Historic Preservation Commission about the property; City Administrator Larry Delo acknowledged that this has been done already.
