- B. Consideration and possible action for the status of three projects that Historic Preservation

Committee members are working on in 2026. Projects include public education program #1, historic property designations, and public education program #2.

City Planner Peter Schleinz noted the projects being worked on in 2026. Patrick Boyd explained that he and Mark Reinhart are working on the fire truck education project. They have started their research but are still working on it. For the targeting of residential & commercial properties, the team has identified 6 properties, including 4 residential properties and 2 commercial properties. Three of the six properties have already expressed interest in designation. Ald. Hansen reported that Gene Hackbarth will reach out to the property owner of the National Bank.

Peter noted that at this time, federal funding is still on hold, so the CLG grant funding is not available at this time. He suggested the HPC get ready for this project but advised to clarify the possibility to the potential property owners. The HPC agreed that they will send the letter when and if funding becomes available. No formal action is needed at this time.
