Summary: I have included information to help you review and approve a sign for out at Volunteer Park. As you know we named the park primarily in recognition of the De Pere Rifleman that served with Company F in the Civil War. These men were predominantly from the De Pere area and were all volunteers. The content and design of the sign was put together by representatives from the De Pere Historical Society. It follows a similar format than several other signs around the City at historical locations.

In reviewing the documents, please see Revised #3 for the latest suggestion. Upon reviewing the sign, I would recommend we slightly reword the intro so that people understand the correlation of the sign and the park. We could do this by starting out the lead paragraph with stating the park is named in honor of the De Pere Rifleman that served in the Civil War and were volunteers.

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In 1861, following President Lincoln's call for 75,000 volunteers to preserve the Union, men from De Pere, Brown County, and elsewhere, volunteered to serve their country. They first organized as the Brown County Rifles, but with so many men from De Pere, they soon became the De Pere Rifles. The group was assigned to Company F of the 14th Wisconsin Volunteer Infantry in Fond du Lac. This park is dedicated to the brave volunteers from Company F and their service to this country.

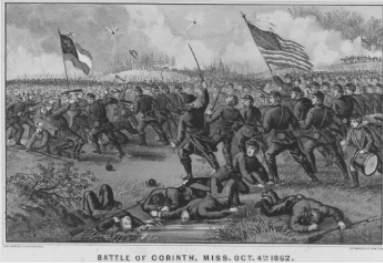


The Battle of Shiloh. Charge and taking of a New Orleans battery by the 14th Regt. Wisconsin Volunteers Monday, April 7, 1862

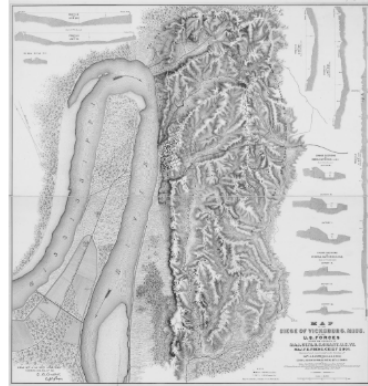

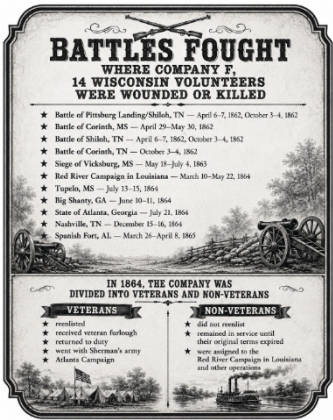

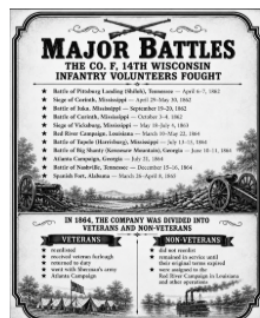

The Depere Rifles

In 1861, following President Lincoln's call for 75,000 volunteers to preserve the Union, 93 area men volunteered to serve their country. They first organized as the Depere Rifles, a few weeks later became the Brown County Rifles, and shortly thereafter, became known as the Depere Rifles again. These volunteers, signed their name or made their mark declaring, "We the subscribers hereto do individually and solemnly swear (or affirm) that we will bear true allegiance to the United States of America and to the State of Wisconsin; that I will serve them honestly and faithfully against all their enemies and opposers whatsoever; and that I will observe and obey the orders of the President of the United States, the Governor of this State and the officers appointed over me according to the rules and articles for the government of the armies of the United States and of this State, so help me God."

This company became known as Company F of the 14th Wisconsin Volunteer Infantry and joined the rest of the regiment in Fond du Lac in the fall of 1861. This park is dedicated to the brave volunteers from Company F at their service to this country.

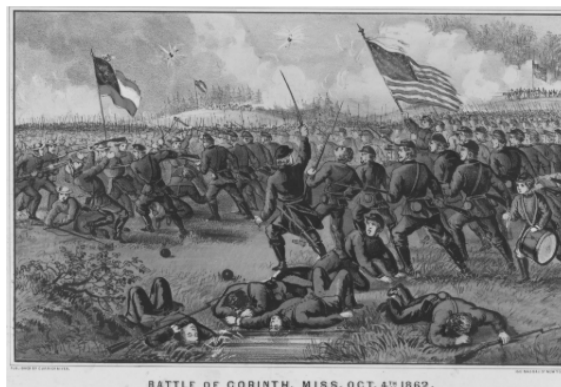

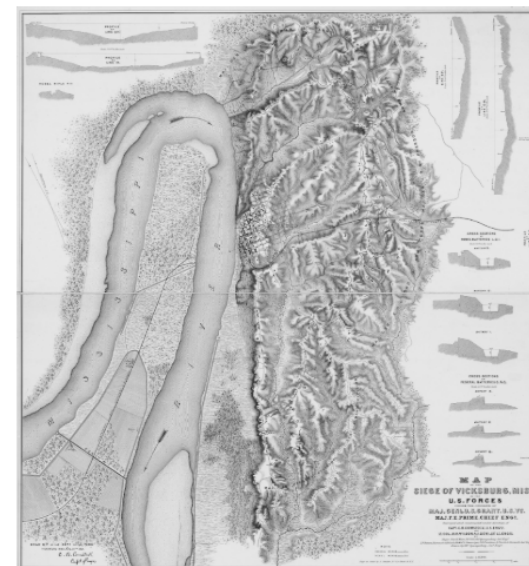

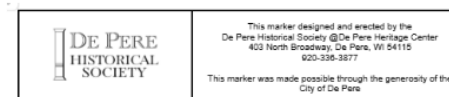

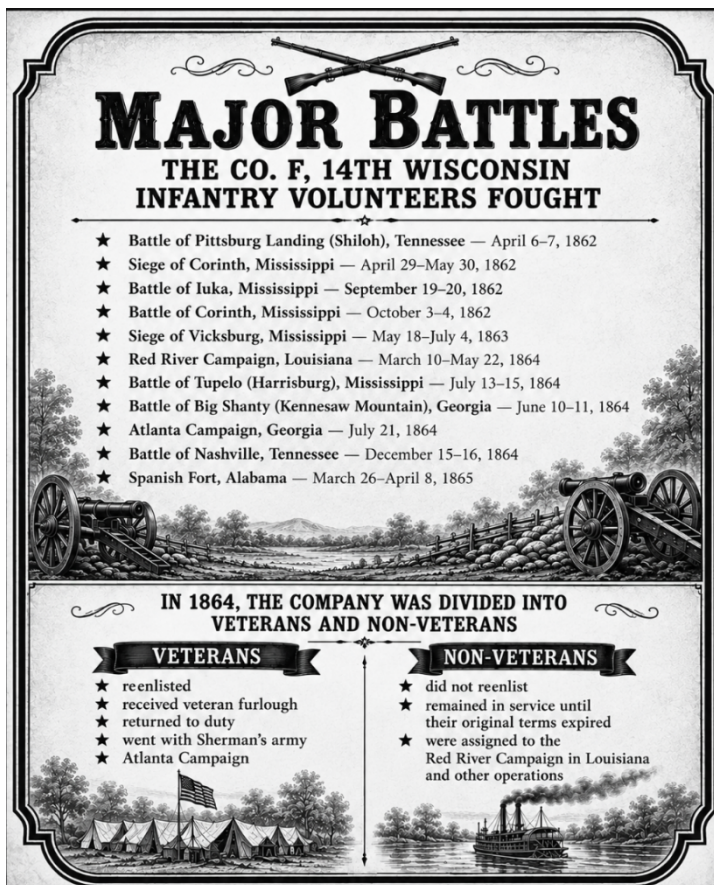
Map of the Siege of Vicksburg, Missouri

The Depere Rifles

In 1861, following President Lincoln's call for 75,000 volunteers to preserve the Union, area men volunteered to serve their country. They first organized as the Depere Rifles, a few weeks later became the Brown County Rifles, and shortly thereafter, became known as the Depere Rifles again. The original volunteers, shown on this marker, signed their name or made their mark declaring, "We the subscribers hereto do individually and solemnly swear (or affirm) that we will bear true allegiance to the United States of America and to the State of Wisconsin; that I will serve them honestly and faithfully against all their enemies and opposers whatsoever; and that I will observe and obey the orders of the President of the United States, the Governor of this State, and the officers appointed over me according to the rules and articles for the government of the armies of the United States and of this State, so help me God." Most of these men became part of Company F of the 14th Wisconsin Volunteer Infantry. They joined the regiment in Fond du Lac in November 1861. Over the course of the war, over 100 more men would join Company F. This park is dedicated to these brave volunteers for their service to our country.

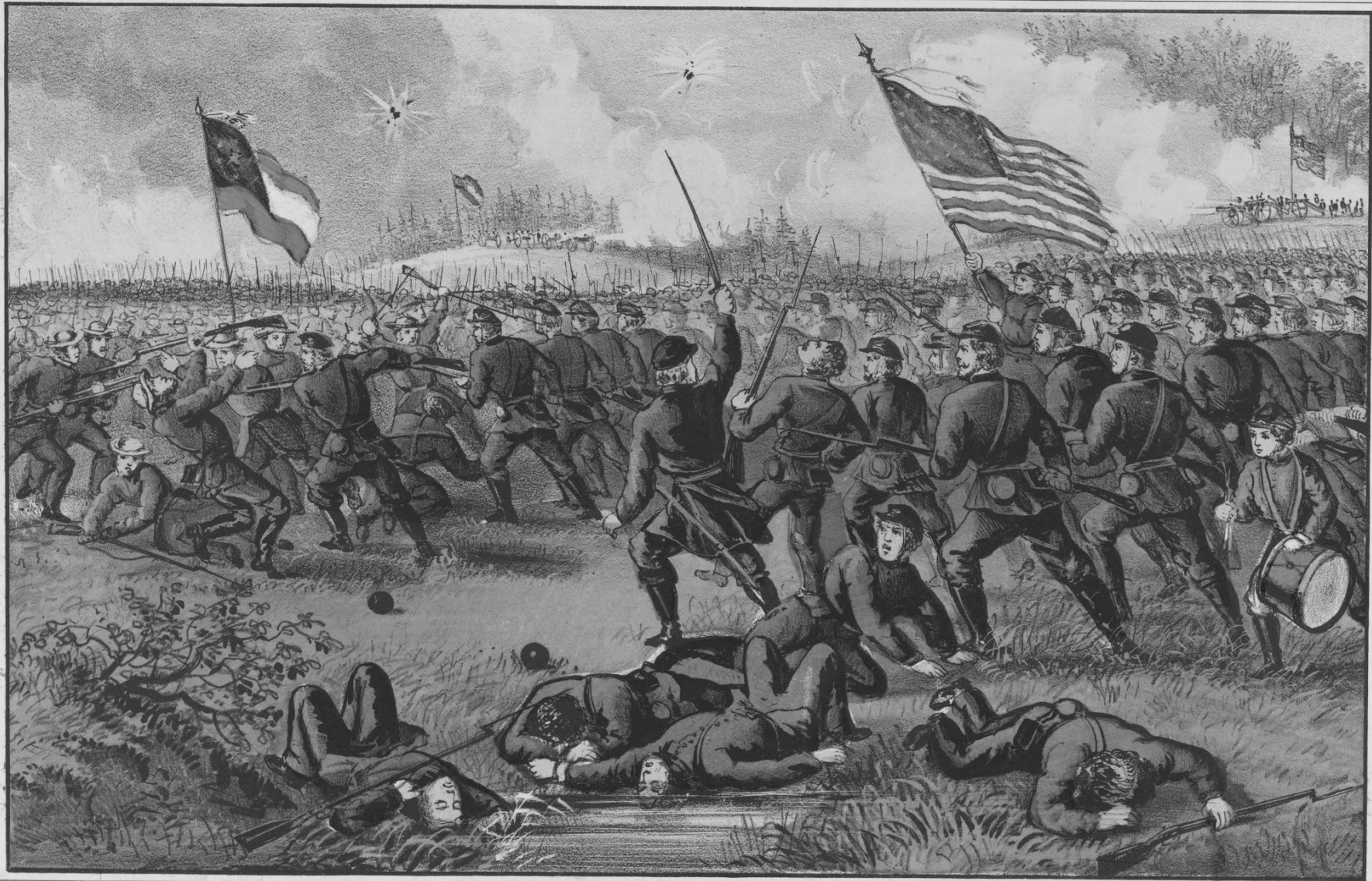

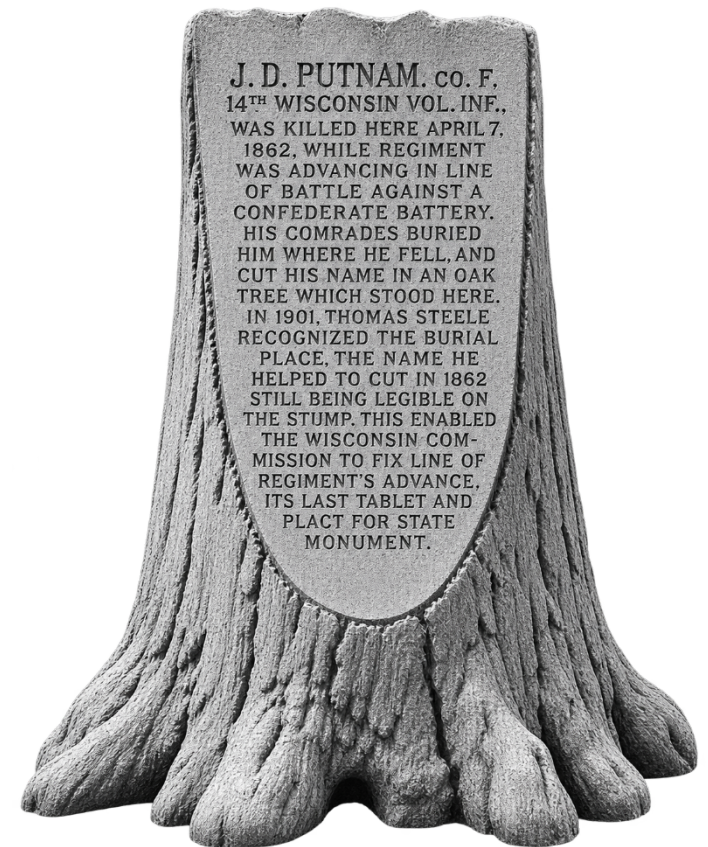

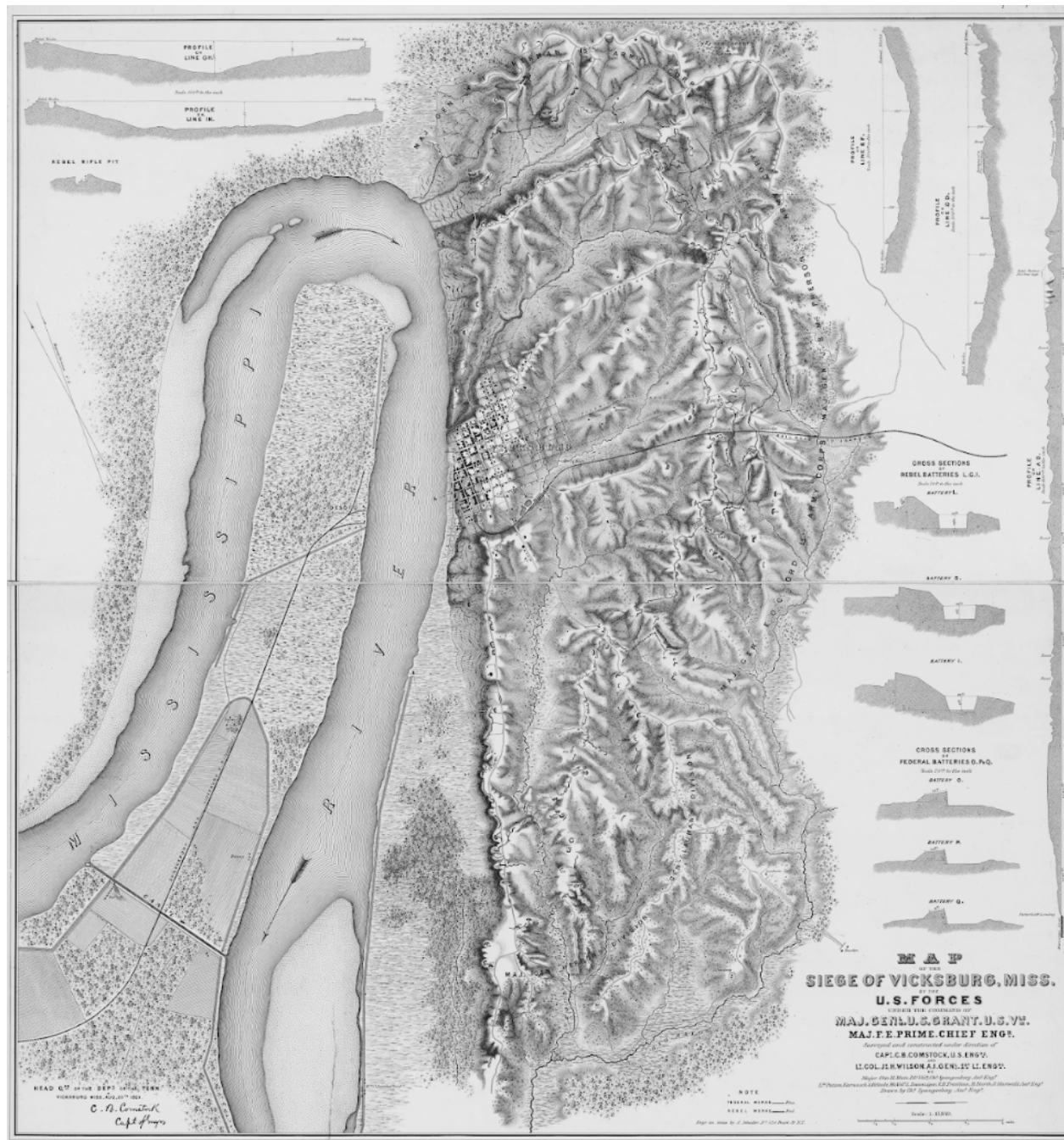
